LONE STAR CED INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

TACDC's Lone Star CED Internship Program provides college and graduate students the opportunity to gain professional experience in the CED field and be exposed to the issues Texas faces in affordable housing, economic development, and neighborhood revitalization.

This human capital initiative is intended to provide additional talent for the community development workforce with the goal of recruiting new people into the industry. TACDC places interns in CDCs throughout the state for 10 to 12 weeks and typically pays 50% of the intern's stipend. The internship program offers CDCs the ability to count on additional staff for the Fall, Spring, or Summer semesters, creates a pool of qualified candidates with experience in community development, and offers hands-on experiential training to potential future employees of CDCs.

Past host organizations include Alamo Area Mutual Housing Association (San Antonio), Brazos Valley Council of Governments (Bryan), Foundation Communities (Austin), Neighborhood Recovery CDC (Houston), Project Bravo (El Paso), Affordable Housing of South TX (McAllen), and City Wide CDC (Dallas). This program is sponsored by BBVA..

401(k) PROGRAM

NETWORKING EVENTS

Annual Community Development Policy Summit

The Texas Community Development Policy Summit brings together legislators, lenders, policy makers, and industry leaders from state government, banking, and affordable housing, to share ideas on community development. For almost two decades TACDC has been organizing this respected forum to promote an earnest and wide-ranging discussion of public policy and its impact on community development activities like affordable housing, job creation, and quality of life. The ultimate goal of each Summit is to thoroughly review current issues in order to help identify public policies that will best support communities in need.

Annual Community Economic Development Conference

The Annual TACDC Community Economic Development Conference provides two days of trainings, breakout sessions, keynote speakers and networking opportunities to help attendees identify industry trends, build capacity and learn from other community development professionals in other areas of the state. Conference participants include nonprofit and for-profit developers from Texas, representatives from state agencies, consultants, bank representatives, and representatives of related national entities. The 2020 Conference will be held March 1-3rd in Corpus Christi.

POLICY AND ADVOCACY

The TACDC Advocacy Program develops sound policy and tangible solutions to the problems facing Texas communities. The program mirrors its Board of Directors, the Community Development Roundtable, and the association's membership who are community based and driven by a mission to improve the existing conditions in the neighborhoods in which they live.

Using a list of member driven Policy Priorities, the Advocacy Program brings TACDC concerns into the public arena by developing relationships with federal, state and local policy makers, building coalitions between other advocacy groups and grassroots organizations, working with local or regional CED associations, and advocating sound

management of the state's housing and economic development resources.

The Advocacy Program accomplishes its objectives by presenting accurate and timely information contained in reasonable policy platforms. These platforms are presented through an annual Community Development Conference, an annual Community Development Policy Summit, regional policy meetings, direct encouragement of sound public policy, and attending and participating in legislative meetings, agency hearings, and a variety of community development conferences. TACDC directly impacts public policy at the local, state and federal levels.

RESEARCH

TACDC's research program regularly produces reports on the status of the community economic development industry in Texas. By working with practitioners and experts in the field, TACDC develops research that reflects the advocacy and capacity building needs of its constituents.

The goal of the Research Program is to provide sound research, timely and accurate data, and cutting-edge information to policymakers, CDCs, and other constituents on community development issues. The resulting publications and white papers often address areas of capacity building, public policy, or CDC industry

development.

The research program informs and supports TACDC's work in policy, advocacy, training, capacity building, and membership services. By promoting sound research principles, accurate data collection, and producing quality reports, the program establishes CDC benchmarks and identifies need within the community development field. Additionally, TACDC research assists CDCs with information for grant writing and internal agency program practices. The TACDC Advocacy Program ensures that CDCs are heard at the State Legislature and Congress by utilizing TACDC's original research to advocate for increased funding for successful community development programs, removing statutory barriers that hinder community-based development, and to guard against policies that are harmful to community building activities. Recent accomplishments include:

- * Maintained CDCs' ability to participate in statewide housing programs.
- * Fought for the protection of the property tax exemption for CHDOs.
- * Helped to significantly increase the Private Activity Bond allocation available for housing development.

TACDC's Advocacy Program centers on sound public policy and workable solutions to the problems facing Texas communities. In that sense, the program mirrors its Board of Directors, the Community Development Roundtable, and the association membership who are community-based and mission-driven to improve existing conditions in the neighborhoods in which they live.

Using a list of membership ranked-and-approved Policy Priorities, the Advocacy Program weaves TACDC concerns into the public arena by developing relationships with federal, state, and local policymakers; building coalitions between other advocacy, public-interest, and grassroots organizations; working with local or regional CED associations; advocating sound management of the state's housing and economic development agencies; developing and maintaining relationships with all news mediums; using TACDC initiated research to bolster policy claims, and initiating and participating in policy campaigns at federal and state levels.

The Advocacy Program accomplishes its duties by presenting accurate and timely information contained in reasonable policy platforms that are presented through an annual Community Development Conference; an annual Policy Summit; direct encouragement of sound public policy, and attending and participating in legislative meetings, agency hearings, and a variety of community development conferences.



To help accomplish its tasks at the National level, the Advocacy Program actively communicates with, monitors and participates in the actions of TACDC's nationally-affiliated advocacy groups such as NACEDA, NCRC and NLIHC, as well as monitoring the federal website Thomas and the Congressional Daily Record to keep abreast of events in Washington, DC. Additionally, TACDC takes part in NACEDA's annual Congressional Lobbying event where the Policy Priorities are presented directly to the Texas Congressional Delegation.

At the State level, TACDC's Advocacy Program maintains excellent relationships with key members of the Texas Legislature and utilizes its general familiarity and knowledge of Legislative inner circles to expand the awareness of TACDC issues.

LONE STAR INTERN PROGRAM

The Lone Star program is TACDC's effort to provide college and graduate students the opportunity to gain work experience in the community economic development field and to be exposed to the issues Texas is facing in affordable housing, economic development, and neighborhood revitalization.

Students participating in Lone Star are hired for an 8-12 week part-time paid internship with a Community Development Corporation (CDC) in Texas. TACDC provides a reimbursement of 50% of the student's stipend, up to \$1,800 per semester in the spring or fall and up to \$2400 for summer for undergraduate students. Higher reimbursements available for graduate students. The other half of the stipend is provided by the CDC hiring the Lone Star Intern. Each intern will have a sponsor/mentor and will be required to complete a brief report detailing the outputs and outcomes of the project during the internship.

Lone Star was created in 2000 to offer our network of CDCs the ability to:

- Provide additional staffing possibilities with student interns training in community development
- Create a pool of qualified candidates with experience in the CDC field for Texas CDC positions
- Offer "hands-on" training to a potential future employee of a CDC
- Establish relationships with universities and colleges for recruiting, research and other collaborations

TACDC recognizes that in order for organizations to increase their capacity, they must be able to recruit qualified professionals who truly are dedicated to improving their communities. The students participating as Lone Star intern candidates have this kind of personal commitment to community economic development. For the 2020-21 program, TACDC will provide a partial stipend to eligible CDCs in Texas to recruit and hire part-time interns.

Details of the program include:

- TACDC will reimburse the CDC half of the intern's stipend up to \$2,400 for undergraduates and \$3,600 for graduate students during the summer semester, and up to \$1800 for the fall or spring.
- Once approved, CDCs can hire interns from any local college or university.
- Interns can have any area of study as their major*.
- Undergraduate interns must have completed at least 60 hours of study or be classified as a junior (third year of study) or senior (4th year of study).
- Applications are accepted on a rolling time frame and Lone Star Internships are available until all slots are filled.
- TACDC anticipates filling 3 - 5 intern positions during each semester.

Application forms for TACDC members seeking a student intern are available on our web site www.tacdc.org. We ask that CDCs participating in Lone Star create an 8-12 week scope of work that will grant students the opportunity to offer a meaningful contribution to the organization. TACDC will approve applications for internships on the strength of the proposed work product and scope of work.

*In the past, undergraduate interns were recruited from fields of study ranging from business administration to political science and must have completed at least 60 credit hours to be eligible for the program. Graduate students were recruited from city and regional planning programs, MBA programs, public policy, and public administration schools from across the state.

Through the implementation of a comprehensive survey designed to accurately portray production of affordable housing,



commercial developments, business enterprise developments, as well as program utilization and funding sources, the Research and Publications Program establishes reliable standards that can be used to measure the effectiveness of specific programs as well as overall policy performance.

By identifying and summarizing relevant policy articles and reports from throughout the country and compiling them for Policy Summit participants, the Research and Publications Program provides a “one-stop shop” of background and research material used to backup the policy aims of TACDC.

Because of its excellent network of community development professionals, the Research and Publications Program conducts ongoing member surveys that can be organized, disseminated, tabulated and analyzed quickly to help steer debates while they are happening. Fast and coordinated response to opposing viewpoints is crucial to steering policy at the Texas Legislature, where decisions are made quickly after minimal debate.

Economic Impact Study

Has your organization ever considered the true economic impact it has on the local and regional economy?

Have you ever considered how many jobs your organization creates and supports every time you build a multifamily or single family development? How much earnings go back into the economy from the labor you hire or the total economic output for every dollar you invest in your community?

TACDC can now help you answer these questions so you can make a more compelling case for support from your funders, help overcome NIMBYism for your new development, and help paint a more complete picture of your organization's impact in the economy.

TACDC can conduct an economic impact analysis using RIMSII data purchased from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis for a region you specify. You can select an area as small as one county to highlight your work and impact on your local economy.

TACDC will estimate the impact on the region's economy from an initial investment in your community and will produce a report that includes estimates of the following:

- Total economic output (multiplier effect) for the region
- Total economic output for highest impacted sectors of the economy
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
